



The MCSD **Hybrid Learning model** is a blend of on-site and off-site access to learning. When on campus, students access in-person teaching and learning which incorporates social distancing and enhanced cleaning measures while following Iowa Department of Education, Centers for Disease Control, and Marshall County Health Department safety guidance. When away from campus, students access teaching and learning through the District's online learning platform.

### **Program Description**

When conditions do not allow all individuals to return to campus for learning due to health and safety reasons, the District will utilize a hybrid learning model in which students access learning both on and off campus.

- 9th-12th grade students would access learning on campus at least one day per week and access learning through the online Canvas platform the other days.
- PK-8th students would access learning on campus at least two days per week (M/T or Th/F), and access learning through Google Classroom the other days.
- Student work and attendance will be required, assessed, and graded.
- Staff and students will be required to wear protective face coverings.
- Social distancing will be practiced, transitions limited, and personal protective equipment will be utilized like desk dividers, hand sanitizers, etc.
- Teachers will be provided ongoing professional learning
- Students must have access to their school device and the internet in this model.
- The district will offer training to families on how to access lessons and support learning if, at any given point, the district transitions to a different learning model.

### **Curriculum, Extracurriculars, & Other Operations**

- Engaging, age-appropriate standards-based lessons that utilize quality resources
- Consistent organization and delivery of instruction utilizing the MCSD platform.
- Interactive instruction will include face-to-face lessons as well as video lessons.
- Social emotional learning needs are embedded into daily lessons.
- On-going feedback provided to students and parents about academic progress.
- Transportation is provided during this time.
- Breakfast and lunch may be provided on-site and via remote locations.
- Extracurricular activities will continue if deemed safe by the state associations, local board, etc.
